#### The Need for More Space

The Brookfield Public Library first opened its doors on June 27, 1914. For over 100 years the Library has served our community as a hub for activities, information gather and learning.

In 1986, the original building was razed, and the current structure was built. The interior of the library, including the basement, was completely remodeled in 1999, and refurbished in 2010. Since then, the Library has grown in books, members and services...but not in space.

Due to increased demand for services and technology, the 13,500 square foot building became inadequate long ago.

Groups of residents are turned away from classes and events because they can't fit into the space. 1,167 residents were turned away or put on waiting lists in 2017. Work space, leisure/reading space and storage is extremely limited.





#### The Plan: A New, Easily Expandable Library

- Raise \$1,400,000 for a 21,000 square foot Library costing approximately \$10.5 million
- Divisible meeting room seating 110 to accommodate events and classes and community groups
- Quiet reading room set apart from noisier, active areas
- Digitally equipped and traditional study rooms to accommodate small and large groups
- A separate children's floor with an activity area and a classroom for family classes and events
- A teen area designed especially for this important age
- · Café area featuring vending and a gathering space
- A makerspace for 3D printing and other technologies for use by adults, students, small businesses and community organizations
- Outdoor green spaces for classes and events


